Portsmouth Gunwharf Quays and Portsmouth Historic Dockyard::

- The Mary Rose – King Henry VIII's warship – raised and conserved from the seabed in new award winning museum
- HMS Victory – as it would have looked at the Battle of Trafalgar and Poop Deck with views of the Dockyard and Naval Base
- HMS M.33 First World War Gallipoli Campaign survivor
- The National Museum of the Royal Navy
- 'Hear my story' and see stories of the navy in war and peacetime
- Exhibition of the Women's Royal Naval Service
- HMS Warrior 1860 iron hulled battleship – walk her decks – experience life of Victorian sailor
- Action Stations 1845 in the Boathouse ships boats maintaining small vessels
- Ninja Force – an assault course with discs, quad steps, hoops nets and more
- Boathouse 4 traditional boatbuilding, small boats of the Navy
- Forgotten Craft exhibition featuring small boats of Navy, boatbuilding skills
- Midships Cookhouse restaurant with views of Portsmouth Harbour

- Diaries, letters, photographs and artefacts from the ships and a Victoria Cross

Portchester Castle stands in a commanding position at the north end of Portsmouth Harbour. The Romans built a huge fort here, which remains the best preserved Roman fort north of the Alps. After the Norman Conquest a castle was built in one corner of the fort, which grew into an impressive royal residence. From 1665 Portchester was frequently used to house foreign prisoners of war, most notably during the wars with France between 1793 and 1815. The parish church of St Mary Portchester is also within the walls of the Castle and is a Norman building, with many items linked to this period.
